Dear Janice,

I would like to thank you for contributing to our efforts to restore the iconic Route 100 barn at Hurricane Valley Farm in Falmouth. Hurricane Valley Farm was slated to become a 17-unit housing subdivision in 2015 but instead the community rallied to purchase the 62 acre property. Today, the farm is used by our partner nonprofit, Cultivating Community, for their vital food security work with new Americans. This 100+ year old barn symbolizes how a committed group of people can come together to reinvigorate a piece of Maine's agricultural heritage. This project cannot happen without supporters like you.

We understand that your generous total pledge of \$25,000 is restricted to the Hurricane Valley Farm Barn Restoration capital campaign. We also understand that you will fulfill this commitment with a gift of \$8,500 in 2022 (received), a pledged gift of \$8,500 in 2023, and a pledged gift of \$8,000 in 2024. If you intend to transfer securities, please contact me and I will provide the information necessary to make that transfer.

In 2023, MCHPP turns 40. Our agency, and the world, have changed immensely since we opened our doors in 1983. But, through it all, our commitment to providing healthy food to anyone in need in an accessible and dignified manner has remained constant. Expansion into our new facility at Brunswick Landing is increasing MCHPP's programmatic capacity, while simultaneously allowing us to better support our smaller partners' work to meet the changing needs of their communities. On behalf of us all, thank you to everyone at Norway Savings for your generous gift and your continued partnership. We were delighted to show your group around our new space.

Here at MCHPP, programs that grew or were born out of the Covid-19 pandemic have come into their own and are flourishing. Mobile Pantry sites in Lisbon, Harpswell, and Bowdoin bring food closer to home for our more rural neighbors, Satellite Pantries give seniors consistent access to healthy food within their housing complexes, and Neighborhood Deliveries reach dozens of families each week with groceries delivered straight to their front door.
